

At a General Assembly of the Company of Proprietors of the GRAND JUNCTION CANAL, held at the Company's Office, 21, Surry Street, Strand, London, in the County of Middlesex, on Tuesday, the Second Day of June, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-three, it was

RESOLVED AND ORDERED—

That the Owner or Person in charge of any Boat, Barge, or other Vessel, not having any Horse on the spot to haul the same, who shall attempt to pass into any Lock on the said Canal until any other Boat then in sight, furnished with a Horse or with Steam Power, shall have passed, shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence the sum of FIVE POUNDS.

RESOLVED AND ORDERED—

That every Boat or Barge shall give way to every Boat commonly called a Fly Boat, and navigated by relays of Horses or Steam Power on this Canal, or the Cuts therefrom, on pain that the Master or Person having the command of such Boat or Barge, and refusing or not allowing any Fly Boat to pass, shall forfeit and pay the sum of TWENTY SHILLINGS.
